## PAINTING



# THE BOULEVARD MONTMARTRE AT NIGHT (1897) BY CAMILLE PISSARRO



Thus, the painting is to be viewed from a distance and not from a point of close proximity.

Pissarro's brushstrokes have an almost gestural quality, as he applied the paint as a patchwork of dashes and daubs to suggest the movement of passing crowds and traffic, and the city's shimmering lights. When viewed up close, the paint has an almost abstract quality. Alive with energy, it complements the activity in the street before us. The element of dynamism and movement that Pissarro intended to capture in reinforced by the conspicuous presence of multiple diagonal lines of the rooftops, pavements, trees, streetlights, and carriages.

The role of the artist, as discussed by Charles Baudelaire in his Le Spleen de Paris (1869), is to 'distil the eternal from the transitory.' Modernity for him was defined by the transient, the fleeting, and the abstract; and the very emblem of this modernity was the city. Baron Haussmann radically reshaped much of Medieval Paris during the Second Republic (1850-70) under Napolean III and is responsible for the wide boulevards, improved drainage system, gas lights etc of Modern Paris. The novel urban spaces, and the commercial and leisure activities fostered by them attracted the Impressionists like Manet, Monet, and others who represented their admiration of modern beauty in their art as they strove to capture the ephemeral and fleeting aspect of city life.

The Boulevard Monmartre at Night, an oil painting on canvas, apart from being the only example of a night painting by the Impressionist painter Pissarro, is also just one of the 14 views of Boulevard Montmartre he painted in 1897 during his stay at the Grand Hôtel de Russie on Rue Drouot. The return of his subject from the rural to the urban perhaps had been prompted by the condition of his eyes which made it difficult for him to paint outdoors. His decision to paint Boulevard Montmartre at different times of the day and during different weather conditions was influenced by Monet's successful series paintings.

Painted from a high vantage point, the one-point perspective is defined by the diagonal lines of the rooftops, pavements, street lamps, carriages, and trees that move parallelly towards the vanishing point, where the apexes of the series of triangles formed by the withdrawal of these lines towards Porte Sainte-Denis in the far distance meet, just to the left of the

painting centre. The effect of depth and space is reinforced further by the plunging 'V' of the night sky which is mirrored by the inverted boulevard below

Pissarro, like his fellow Impressionists, was very fascinated by the various effects and interplay of both natural and artificial light. The absence of natural light in the sky is contrasted by the abundance of artificial light emanating from the new electric streetlamps, the oil-lamps of the cabs, and from the gaslights of the shops. The cool white of the newly installed electric street lamps along the centre of picture contrasts with the warm yellow gaslights of shop windows and the oil-burning lamps of cabs that line the street. This impression of the varying tones of artificial light is further enhanced by the reflection of this light on the wet pavement, as Pissarro captured the scene after it had been raining. The effect of this is evidently visible on the right-hand side of the picture plane.

The painting depicts the isolation of man amid the city streets bustling with people, and it also captures the effect of the isolated, shapeless, and faceless crowd(s). Impressionism deliberately turned a blind eye to contouring, thereby reducing man to shapeless blobs without any distinct outlines as man was rendered insignificant and completely overwhelmed by modern consumerism, mechanization, and industrialization.

Though he didn't complete the painting in one sitting, and some areas of it have been repainted, his application of paint is direct and immediate. The painting is composed based on an aspect of distance thereby leading to a conflict between the manner in which the eye sees and the way it perceives.

# AMAZING FACTS ABOUT WHALES!

#### 1. Whales Are Mammals!

#### 2. Whale Species Diversity

- There are over 80 species of whales, dolphins, and porpoises, grouped into two main categories: toothed whales (Odontoceti) and baleen whales (Mysticeti).
  - Toothed whales include species like orcas (killer whales), sperm whales, and dolphins. They have teeth and hunt individual prey.
  - Baleen whales include blue whales, humpback whales, and gray whales. They have baleen plates in their mouths to filter food like krill and small fish.

#### 3. Blue Whales: The Largest Animals on Earth

 The blue whale is the largest animal to ever have lived on Earth, reaching lengths of up to 100 feet (30 meters) and weights of up to 200 tons. A blue whale's heart alone can weigh as much as a small car (about 1,300 pounds or 590 kg).

#### 4. Long Migration Distances

 Some whale species, such as gray whales, migrate over incredible distances—up to 12,000 miles (19,000 km) annually, from feeding grounds in the Arctic to breeding grounds in warmer tropical waters. This is one of the longest migrations of any mammal.

#### 5. Whales Communicate Using Complex Sounds

 Whales, especially toothed whales and baleen whales, use a variety of vocalizations to communicate and navigate. These sounds can include clicks, whistles, and songs. Humpback whales are especially known for their long, complex songs that can last up to 20 minutes and be heard by other whales over vast distances.
